## **Testing a Minimum Core Dataset (MCD) to Monitor and Evaluate Community Link Worker Programmes**

Scottish Government (SG) asked NHS Health Scotland (HS) to develop plans to monitor and evaluate Community Link Worker programmes with the aim of capturing learning to inform ongoing delivery. HS has worked closely with local 'early adopter' Link Worker<sup>1</sup> teams and the Local Intelligence Support Team (LIST) in NHS National Services Scotland to:

- understand the evaluability of the programmes and evaluation priorities
- develop a simple minimum core dataset (MCD) that aligns with data already being collected locally
- begin testing the MCD to ensure quality and completion of data
- provide support to implement the MCD, and analysis and reporting of data for local and national learning

The MCD could be a valuable tool for HSCPs by:

- informing local Programme learning and national understanding of Link Worker services
- providing a useful tool for HSCPs to inform Primary Care Improvement Plans
- providing additional HSCP areas with a ready to use data tool and support – some areas already plan to use the MCD for local monitoring and evaluation
- ensuring findings are interpreted and shared in a way that maximises continuous learning across Scotland

The MCD will also enable further evaluation to understand the nature, development and impact of the programmes by carrying out data linkage to routine data (e.g. prescribing information, healthcare utilisation).<sup>2</sup>

The current data fields have been developed and agreed in partnership with local Programme teams, Scottish Government, the Local Intelligence Support Team

(LIST) in NHS National Services Scotland and NHS Health Scotland. The MCD will be tested across each site and reviewed to ensure data being collected adds to current understanding of the Programme and learning across Scotland.
